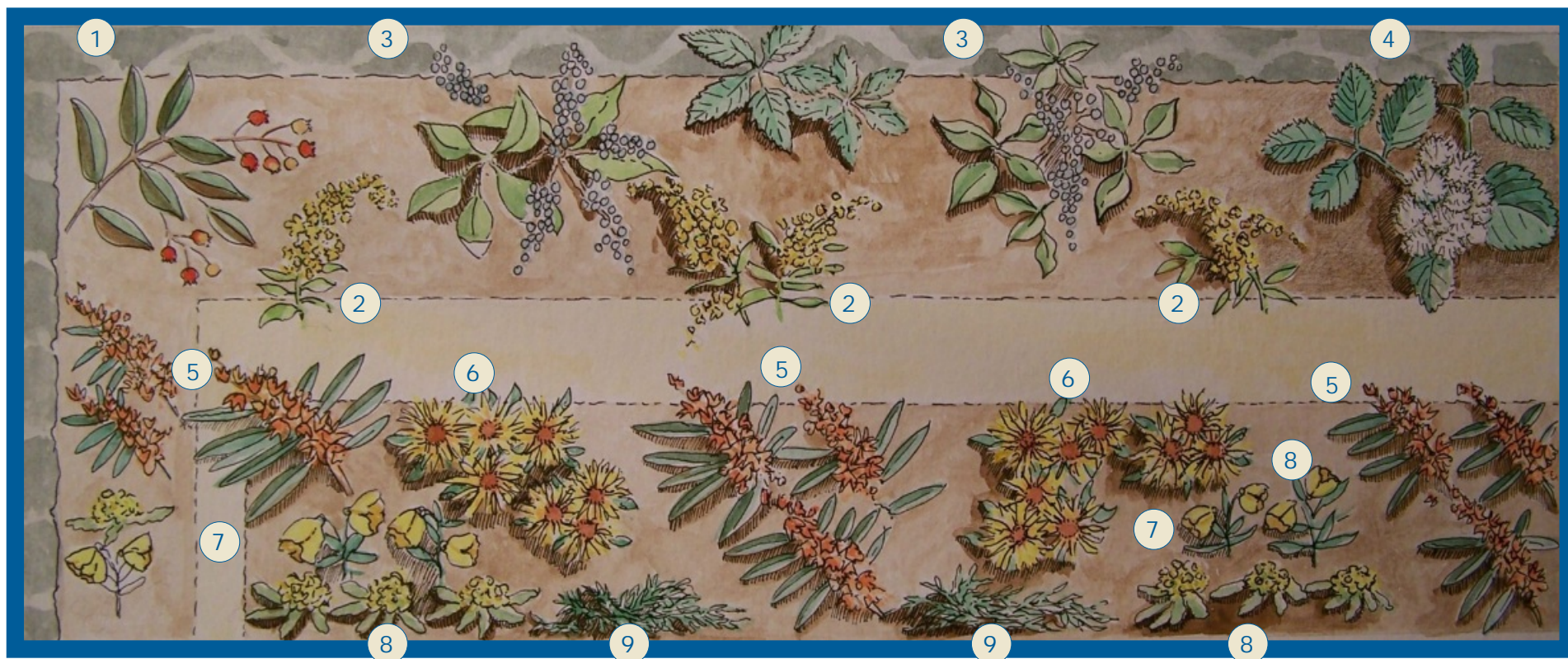


Bayscape for Barnegat Bay No. 1: Butterfly Garden

Designed to thrive in full sun and dry conditions, this garden features yellows, golds and oranges with long blooming seasons that will attract butterflies all season long. This illustration is from the guide to our coastal native plant demonstration garden at the Maris Stella Retreat & Conference Center in Harvey Cedars on Long Beach Island, NJ. We have adapted the plan for general use on page 2 and include layout, spacing, and details about each plant.

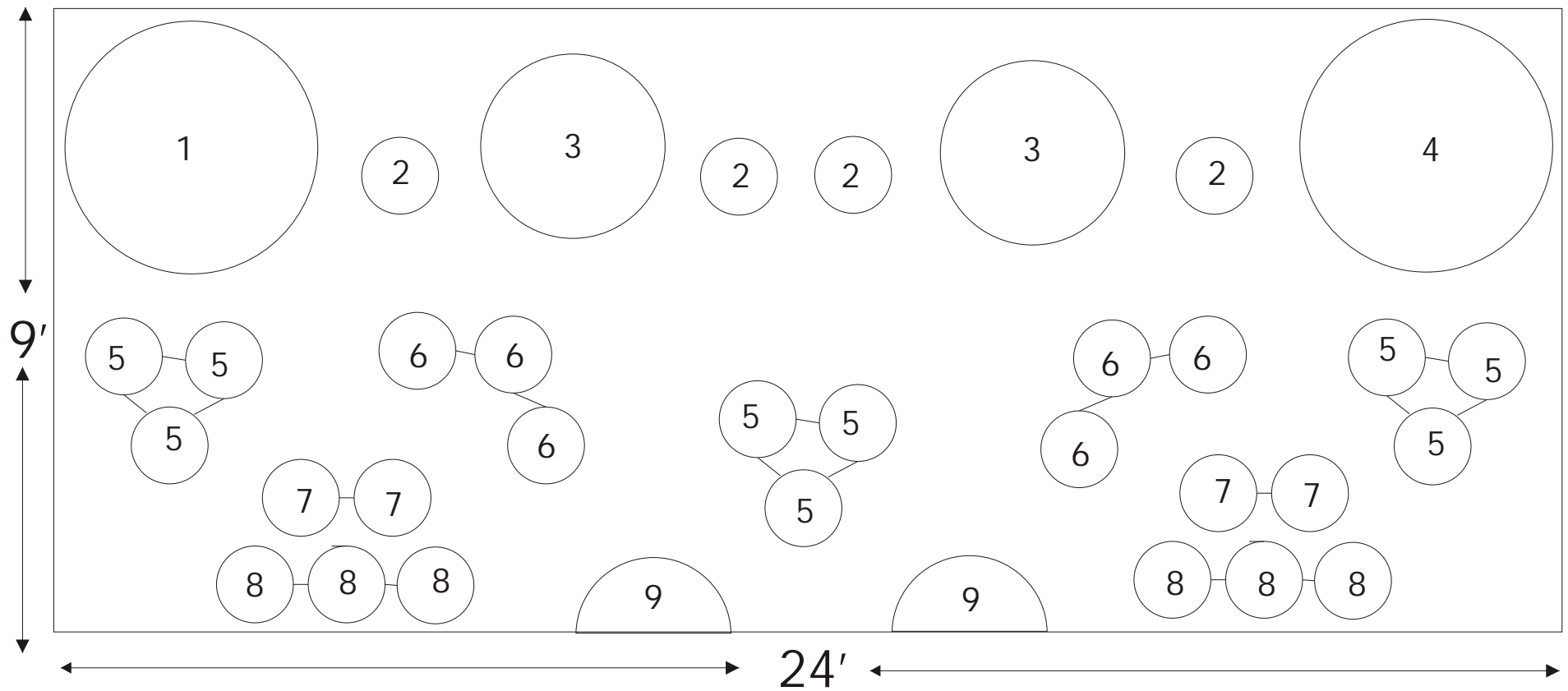
If you don't live in the Barnegat Bay watershed, these plants will thrive in most areas of New Jersey and will help improve a waterway near you.

Bayscape for Barnegat Bay No. 1 - Butterfly Garden



1. Serviceberry (*Amelanchier*) - native also known as shadbush; full to partial sun; grows to 15 - 25' tall, white flowers in spring, edible summer fruit and red fall color.
2. Seaside Goldenrod (*Solidago*)- perennial, full sun, drought and salt tolerant; 1 - 5' tall arching spikes of yellow flowers bloom late summer until frost.
3. Bayberry (*Myrica Pensylvanica*) - semi-evergreen native shrub; silvery-gray berries in fall; glossy aromatic foliage can reach 9' but usually 4 - 5'; full to partial sun; can take sandy soil, wind and salt spray; drought tolerant.
4. Arrowwood (*Viburnum dentatum*) - deciduous native shrub grows to 6'; white flowers in showy clusters in May; bright red leaves and black berries (attract birds) in fall.
5. Butterfly Weed (*Asclepias tuberosa*)- perennial native; full sun; grows 2 - 3' tall; fair salt tolerance, good drought tolerance; attracts butterflies; self sows.
6. Blanket Flower (*Gaillardia*) - 24 - 30" tall, yellow daisy-like flower with red center; full sun; drought tolerant.

7. Evening Primrose (*Oenothera tetragonal*) - perennial native; drought tolerant; moderate to good salt tolerance; full sun.
8. Woolly Yarrow (*Achillea tomentosa*) - perennial native; 16" tall; yellow flowers with gray-green woolly foliage; full sun; can take poor soil.
9. Creeping Juniper (*Juniperus horizontalis*) - native evergreen shrub; 7" tall; mat-forming; full sun; salt and wind tolerant.
